
This year's theme is **Ready**, **Set**, **Read** and will focus on empowering young people to forge new connections with others and unleash the power of play, sport and physical activity through reading.


I really enjoyed reading this book and I found it very funny and silly in parts. Loki is very mischievous. I loved the front cover of this book. Daisy, aged 10
